I want to start out this month's report with an apology for not having an article for your reading enjoyment in the November


449er. It appears there was a mix up between yours truly and the editor. We've taken steps to be sure this does not happen again.

News & Info.....

- 1- The new health care law is The Affordable Care Act. Simply speaking, the act will have very little impact on TRICARE beneficiaries. Beneficiaries who receive TRICARE benefits, whether at no cost, by electing to pay an enrollment fee, or by paying monthly premium have minimum essential coverage under the act.
- 2- Starting in 2014, Americans who do not have health insurance coverage may have to pay a fee when they file their income taxes. The amount will be a flat fee or a percentage of taxable household income, depending on which amount is higher. The fees for an individual will be phased in according to the following schedule: \$95.00 or 1% of taxable income in 2014, \$325.00 or 2% of taxable income in 2015, \$695.00 for taxable income in 2016. What in the world do leaping lords, French hens, swimming swans and especially the partridge who won't come out of the pear tree have to do with Christmas?

"From 1558 until 1829, Roman Catholics in England were not permitted to practice their faith openly. Some one during that era wrote this carol as a catechism song for young Catholics. It has two levels of meaning---the surface meaning plus a hidden meaning known only to members of their church. Each' element in the carol has a code word for a religious reality which children could remember."

"The partridge in the pear tree was Jesus Christ.

Two turtle doves were the Old and New Testaments.

Three French hens stood for faith, hope and charity.

The four calling birds were the gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John.

The five golden rings recalled the Torah or Law, the first five books of the Old Testament.

The six geese a-laying stood for the six days of creation. Seven swans a-swimming represented the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit---Prophesy, Serving, Teaching, Exhortation, Contribution, Leadership and Mercy.

Eight maids a-milking were the eight beatitudes.


Membership is runing behind the 800 Member Goal. We are currently at 600. Membership attrition is taking its toll.



I served in the US Army Air Corp, 20th Air Force, from July 1943 to February 1945. I was stationed on the Island of Guam, Marina Island Chain, Central Pacific, 24th Air Depot Group, 314 Bomb Wing, US Air Corp, from November 1944 to February 1946. We were at North Field, Guam. My duties were issuing navigational equipment to the Navigators of the *Infamous B-29 Super Fortress*.

After repeated extensive bombing raids and the final blow, an Atomic Bombing, Japan finally surrendered on August 15, 1945, unconditionally.

On September 18, 1946, the Army Air Corp officially became the U.S. Air Force, with Academy and Campus headquartered in Colorado Springs, Colorado,.

PROPOSED BY-LAW AMENDENTS

Stenz-Griesell-Smith American Legion Post 449 3245 N.124th Street, Brookfield, Wisconsin Date: November 12, 2013



The Post Executive Board has unanimously approved the following proposed changes to the Stenz-Griesell-Smith American Legion Post 449 By-Laws.

ARTICLE II

SECTION 1:

Add subparagraph (a) "The term of office for all elected Post Executive Members will be a two (2) year term beginning with the June installation of officers in 2014. Any and all vacancies to this term of office (for any reason) are listed in Section 5 of these BY-LAWS".

SECTION 3:

Change the word "year" to "term".

ARTICLE IX

SECTION 6:

Add to the Post Adjutant's duties, "The Post Adjutant shall also be responsible to keep both an electronic and hard copy of the current Post 449 By-Laws and announce or publish any changes made to them".







