



### Chaplain' Corner

Sometime ago I purchased a self inking stamp which I use on U.S. mail envelopes. The message is: "In God We Trust". A question arose . . 'how and why has this short message come to be placed on our coins and our paper money'?



Our country had been engaged in the Civil War for seven months. The Union had suffered through the battles of Fort Sumter and Bull Run; the tide of the war was very low.

Upset with the Godlessness of a nation at war with itself, a Rev. M.R. Watkinson, pastor of a small parish in Ridleyville, PA, in November of 1861, wrote an eloquent letter to the Secretary of the Treasury. He stated that the recognition of almighty God had been overlooked on our coinage. What if our republic was now shattered beyond reconstruction? Would not future century experts determine rightly that ours was a country of heathens? For U.S. coins, he proposed a motto with a theme of *God*, *Liberty*, *Law*.

The Secretary of the Treasury under Lincoln, Salmon P. Chase, later to become Supreme Court Chief Justice Case, saw merit in this pastor's plea. He immediately instructed the director of the Philadelphia Mint to "cause a device to be prepared, without unnecessary delay, with a motto expressing in the fewest and tersest of words possible, this national recognition".

Before the end of the year (1861), a bronze pattern for a \$10 gold piece with the motto *God*, *Our Trust* had been submitted. Shortly after, another had been suggested. . . . *Our Country, Our God*.

Time passed, and finally in 1864, the motto *In God We Trust* appeared on a United States coin. Salmon P. Chase proposed the inscription for the coin, a Two Cent piece.

How fitting this motto is 149 years later, when again our nation is at war. How fitting when our nation and world experience threats of Godlessness, and also more fitting than the motto on the Fugio Cent, the first coin issued by the United States - - - "Mind Your Business".

God bless our fighting troops, our comrades, their families, and grant eternal rest to our gallant fallen.







### From the Archives of Post 449

Coast Guard Petty Officer 3rd Class **Dolores (Denfeld) Schubilske** Parachute Rigger, World War II Legionnaire, American Legion Post 449

When Dolores enlisted in the Coast Guard, the United States was already into its third year of World War II. All across America, women were doing their part contributing to the war efforts by collecting rationed goods, selling war bonds, and working in factories building much-need parts and equipment for the war.

Dolores was born in Wausau, Wis. on her parents' farm. After high school, she moved to Milwaukee, where she landed a job as a seamstress, sewing parachutes. Throughout her stint of almost two years with the company, she thought her hard work of repairing the material was for servicemen who jumped out of airplanes. She later learned what the parachutes she and the company were making were really used for . . . . slowing the fall of the bombs while the aircraft safely escaped the blast areas,

While living and working in Milwaukee, Dolores developed an interest in the Coast Guard. On Aug. 4, 1944, on her 20th birthday and on the 154th birthday of the Coast Guard, she joined the Coast Guard's Women's Reserves - SPARs - created by Congress in November 1942.

After boot camp, she reported to "A" school in Lakehurst, N.J. where she entered the parachute rigger rating. She was one of only six women among 200 members in her class. After three months in "A" school, and as a parachute rigger third class, she landed at Air Station Elizabeth City, N.C., where she spent the next several months until the end of the war packing parachutes for jumpers and for air sea rescue packages that were dropped from the back of airplanes. There were only 18 women in the entire Coast Guard rated as parachute riggers.


Lt. Colonel Todd Walton

Colonel Todd Walton, Chief of Standardization, 128th Air Refueling Wing, Wisconsin Air National Guard. He has deployed numerous times in support of Operation Enduring Freedom, Operation Iraqi Freedom, and Operation Unified Protector, flying refueling missions in Afghanistan, Iraq, and Libya. He also has flown domestically in support of Operation Noble Eagle and performed aeromedical evacuation missions.

She moved back to Milwaukee where she married and started a family. When her husband passed away, she raised three boys and three girls by herself in the same house she lives in today.

Almost 70 years after being discharged, Dolores still speaks highly of the Coast Guard and is extremely proud of her involvement as a member of the Women's Reserve and her service to her country. You can see it in her eyes, and hear it in her voice.

Today, she remains active with other service personnel from the Navy, Coast Guard and Marines as a member of a local WAVES organization - Women Accepted for Volunteer Emergency Service - the Navy's reserve organization for women during the war. She also volunteers at a local senior citizens' house, enjoys a hobby of cutting stones and making them into jewelry, and at the age of 89 she still travels extensively with family and friends.

Earlier this year, Dolores elected to ensure her legacy remains an important part of Coast Guard history by donating her uniform back to the Coast Guard, where it will soon be on display at the Coast Guard 9th District offices in Cleveland. She said she didn't want to give it to an organization or museum and risk having it just sit in a box.

As a major milestone approaches next year, you can be sure Dolores Schubilske will continue to remain active with her family, friends and country, proudly sharing cherished memories as a parachute rigger in the U.S. Coast Guard.
