I'm happy to report that your Honor Guard received very generous donations to our Post from the following; The Auxiliary Unit, The Duffy Family, and the Muxfeld Family..

We have made a 3rd request to receive replacement rifles for the Honor Guard. Apparently the first requests were lost at TACOM headquarters.

V.A. News & Info.....

1- There is a new program for Wisconsin's Purple Heart Veterans which allows them free admission to the following venues; The Milwaukee County Zoo, The Milwaukee Public Museum, Discovery World, Milwaukee Art Museum, Harley Davidson Museum and all attractions at Milwaukee County Parks.

2- On October 1, 2013, more than 171K retirees will be pushed off Tricare Prime (the military's managed care program). The policy change will affect retirees, their family members and military survivors who reside more than 40 miles from a military treatment facility or from a base closure site. Affected veterans will need to shift health care coverage from Prime to Standard.

3- Walmart has announced a plan to hire every veteran who wants a job, provided that the veterans have left the military in the previous year and had an honorable discharge. The program will officially begin on Memorial Day and will eventually lead to the hiring of more than 100,000 veterans in the next five years.

4- Military OneSource & H&R Block have again joined forces to provide a free online tax preparation service for all service members. Two services, the Basic and Premium are provided through H&R Block. The Basic service is free, and the Premium service would apply to taxpayers who must file Schedule C returns.

Chaplain' Corner...

Isaac Potts, a Quaker, was in his mid twenties, lived in Valley Forge, Pennsylvania when American Revolutionary Forces were encamped in the area during the winter of 1777-78. Mr. Potts was a Tory and



was not in favor of the war against the British, but was involved with the grinding of requisitioned grain, which farmers were delivering for General Washington's 8000 starving men. Conditions were such that it was at one time reported that 3000 of Washington's troops were unfit for duty for lack of clothing and shoes.

Some leaders of Congress were plotting to relieve Washington of his command. Washington was considering disbanding his forces to avoid wholesale starvation.

Mr. Potts, a "rank" Tory, told of how he was converted to the cause of freedom. "There laid the army of Washington." (in a woods he one day was passing on horseback) "I heard the plaintive sound as of a man at prayer. I tied my horse to a sapling, went into the woods and to my astonishment I saw the great George Washington on his knees alone with his sword on one side and his cocked hat on the other. He was at prayer to the God of the Armies. Washington was praying for Divine aid when many were ready to give up the ship."

Potts went home, told his wife about what he had seen and they were both astonished that a soldier could also be a Christian...but if there's one it would be Washington. Potts then said, "We thought it was the cause of God and that America could prevail!!!"

Likewise, in our present circumstances, we of this great nation also may pray and have faith that again America can and will prevail.

Battle of Chipyong-ni

The Battle of Chipyong-ni, also known as the Battle of **Dipingli**, was a decisive battle of the Korean War, and it took place from 13-15 February 1951 between members of the US 23rd Infantry Regiment and various units of the Chinese People's Volunteer Army (PVA). It took place in the village of Chipyongni, present-day Jipyeong-ri. The result was a United Nations Command victory. The battle, along with the Third Battle of Wonju, has been called "the Gettysburg of the Korean War," and represents the "high-water mark" of the Chinese incursion into Korea. Due to the ferocity of the Chinese attack and the heroism of the defenders, the battle has also been called, "one of the greatest regimental defense actions in military history."

Tet: Turning War point in the Vietnam War

In the early morning hours of January 30, 1968, the first day of Tet, the Vietnamese celebration of the lunar New Year, soldiers of the South Vietnamese National Liberation Front (NLF) breached the wall surrounding the American embassy in Saigon. They then raced across the compound where they tried but failed to enter the main building. The NLF soldiers (derisively known as the "Viet Cong" to the Americans and their Saigon allies) sprayed the embassy with rockets and fought a six-hour battle with American military police. All nineteen NLF soldiers were killed or badly wounded along with five Americans and one South Vietnamese employee of the embassy. One reporter at the scene of the battle described it as "a butcher shop in Eden." This attack on the very citadel of American power in South Vietnam was brazen in and of itself, but it soon became clear that this was the opening battle of a nationwide military offensive by the NLF and the North Vietnamese that shook the foundations of the American military and political establishment.

Remembering Iwo Jima

Although his memories of Iwo Jima are more than six decades old, Bruce Bender remembered the volcanic

ash, the pungent smell of sulfur and oppressive heat with vivid clarity as he sat in his Costa Mesa home.

Bender was one of the first Marines to set foot on that desolate island in the Pacific in 1945. For those men, things started out calmly enough. But not for long.

The barrage began when the third wave of Marines arrived on shore. After that, it didn't end for two days. "They were shooting at us — we were digging holes," Bender said.

Of the 29 men who Bender came with, he was one of three to survive the battle's bloodshed and the only one to leave unscathed.

February marks the 67th anniversary of the storming of Iwo Jima. Bender, now 88, is one of an exponentially shrinking number of World War II veterans still alive to share their memories.

Bender can remember with great clarity the tasks set before the Marines in the days before the attack. Three groups were to ascend Mt. Suribachi, eventually making the island safe for U.S. pilots to land and use as a stop before heading to the Japanese mainland.

As it were, the planned five-day mission turned into a bloody commitment lasting over one month, where more than 6,000 Americans lost their lives and about 18,000, or 90%, of the Japanese defenders were killed, according to the military's estimates.

Despite the tremendous loss of life, Bender said that without the capture of Iwo Jima, more aviators would have been killed. "Iwo Jima was a necessary battle because it was needed as a safety valve for B-29 bombers," Bender said as he sat at the kitchen table. As he spoke of his time in the Pacific Theater, Bender reflected that prior to the storming of Iwo Jima was a three-day bombardment by the U.S. Navy. It left the land bleak, with no vegetation and no reprieve from the intense sun.

Suribachi was pockmarked with caves and other well-concealed hiding places where the Japanese would shoot at the Marines, the origin of the shots nearly impossible to determine, Bender said.

With the constant sulfurous gas and heat, Bender said he was amazed that there were Japanese defenders capable of living on the island. He said the Japanese wore gas masks as protection from the fumes.

TIME Magazine, March 5th, 1945, wrote, "no battle of World War II -- not even Normandy -- was watched with as much interest as the battle of Iwo Jima."

U.S. Fails on Russia POW Search – The following is excerpted from the December 11, 2012 Washington Times *Inside the Ring* column by Bill Gertz:

[Begin Excerpt]

A joint U.S.-Russia presidential commission set up on 1992, to resolve cases of missing U.S. troops, is largely defunct . . . another casualty of the administrations questionable reset policy with Moscow, according to prisoner of war activist and author Mark Sauter.

Mr. Sauter says there is evidence that U.S. Air Force pilots were taken to Russia during the Korean War and never returned. "The U.S.-Russia Joint commission on POW/MIAs (USRJC), a presidential commission supported by the Pentagon, produced important information in the 1990's, but is now essentially defunct due to Russian foot-dragging and an absence of U.S. resolve," he wrote in a blog post Tuesday.

According to a Pentagon fact sheet, Russia disbanded its participation in the commission in

2006 and blocked access by U.S. analysts to Russian archives. Then, in January 2010, the Russians restored U.S. access to the archives. Six months later, then-Russian President Dmitry Medvedev, issued a decree setting up the Russian side of the commission again.

"I'd like to ask President Obama one question: Ex-Soviet officials admitted they took our Air Force pilots to Russia, and experts on the president's own POW/MA commission agreed it happened. So why – more than a decade later – don't we have those men or their remains home?" Mr. Sauter told *Inside the Ring*. [End Excerpt]


