Finance Officer Report

I apologize for not sharing our financial status sooner but I was not comfortable with the numbers until adjustments were made by our accounting firm.

Our fiscal year ending August 31st incurred an operating loss of \$28,900 after depreciation expense of \$43,900 resulting in positive cash flow of \$15,000.

The first two months of the current fiscal year, Sept. and Oct., had operating income of \$3,500 and \$4,600 respectively for a year-to-date total of \$8,100 after YTD depreciation of \$7,300 or a total YTD cash flow of \$15,400.

With the exception of lunches, the Post is performing well. Plans are afoot to implement changes to improve the lunch operation.

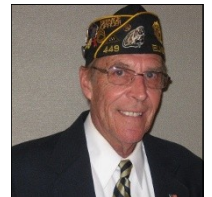
At this time, we were expecting to have consolidated financial statements of Post 449 with the inclusion of former Post 23 numbers but are unable to due to a member's refusal to surrender the assets of what is known as "cabin operations". This action is against our By-Laws but the member is attempting to amend the By-Laws or create an exception. Having ten percent of Post assets under the control of a member is not prudent and even dangerous. The By-Laws are specifically designed to prevent a rogue member from holding post assets hostage. Hopefully this will be resolved quickly.

There is another financial issue concerning the merger which needs to be addressed with the General Membership. It is too involved to be explained here so we expect the Executive Committee will present it at the General Meeting.

I will soon be leaving for Florida but will be available if necessary on my cell (414-573-0408). Going forward, Mike Smith will be keeping you informed and will avail himself to answer your questions.

V.A. News & Info:

1- Military parents of children with autism have been waiting anxiously for Congress to reconvene after Election Day and finish work on a fiscal 2017 defense authorization bill. The delay might not worry lawmakers. But some military families know that how fast the bill gets negotiated, passed and signed will determine whether their children will see their therapy treatments for severe autism altered or interrupted, possibly for months.

2- An [Army](#) vet who suffers from [post-traumatic stress disorder](#) after tours of duty in Iraq and Afghanistan claims in a lawsuit that American Airlines refused to let her board a plane with her service dog. The Army Times reports that Lisa McCombs, of Gulfport, Miss., brought the lawsuit, saying she was humiliated last year when airline staff refused to let her fly home with the dog who helps her deal with her disability and has the papers to prove it. McCombs left the Army as a captain in 2009 after four years of service. The dog is a chocolate Labrador Retriever named Jake. The Army Times reported that it tried to interview McCombs about the lawsuit but she referred a reporter to her attorney. The paper reported that when it reached the attorney he declined to comment. The lawsuit says Jake wasn't allowed to fly with McCombs even though the airline says it welcomes service dogs on flights. It took McCombs and Jake two days to fly home. WLOX-TV reported that the lawsuit says American Airline agents were rude and condescending to McCombs in Kansas. The lawsuit says agents asked her "Are you trying to fly with that?" and "What is your disability anyway?" according to the station. Her lawsuit claims violations under the Americans with Disabilities Act and seeks unspecified damages. American Airline spokesman Matt Miller told the Army Times that Jim Palmersheim, the airline's senior manager of Military and Veterans Programs, spoke to McCombs immediately after the incident. He also said the airline had no comment on the lawsuit.

3- The American Legion's 112-page publication that pays tribute to Old Glory – "Indivisible: The Story of Our Flag" – is once again available for purchase online. The Legion reissued the collectible American Legion Centennial bookazine due to popular demand. The flag bookazine tells the story of the "Star-Spangled Banner" through colorful photos, illustrations, quotations, musical lyrics, poems, fun facts, mysteries and more. "Indivisible" is available for \$9.95 on the [American Legion website](#). Bulk orders of 25 or more cuts price to \$7.95 each. Orders can also be placed by calling Emblem Sales toll-free at (888) 453-4466.

4- If you use TRICARE or CHAMPVA as your primary healthcare benefit program, you know that it is a valuable option to the families of the men and women who serve in the U.S. Armed Forces. However, there are out-of-pocket expenses that TRICARE leaves behind for retired military and their family...and that is when TRICARE Supplement insurance steps in! A TRICARE/CHAMPVA Supplement can help save qualified retirees time and money by covering doctor co-pays, prescriptions and more. A TRICARE/CHAMPVA Supplement Plan Covers doctor & prescription co-pays, covers cost shares, no referrals required, is guaranteed issue, is available in most states and U.S. territories.

5- Our new Commander in Chief has proposed an almost Reaganesque plan to boost the size of the military. He called for increasing the size of the Army to about 540,000 active-duty soldiers, the Marine Corps to 36 battalions, the Navy to 350 surface ships and submarines, and the Air Force to at least 1,200 fighter aircraft. By comparison, the Pentagon's \$583 billion budget proposal for Fiscal 2017, which began Oct. 1, requests funding for 460,000 active soldiers, 24 Marine infantry battalions, 287 naval ships and roughly 1,170 fighter aircraft (excluding A-10 ground attack aircraft) -- all for the active component. The figures don't take into account additional troops and equipment for the Guard and Reserve. Trump didn't specify how he would work with Congress to fund such a plan, which would cost tens of billions of dollars, at least. Many troops who responded to

the Military.com survey said they welcomed his comments that he "would listen to the generals" in deciding on military matters, including combat operations. At the same time, the candidate has suggested he would look to replace military leadership if elected to office: "They'd probably be different generals, to be honest with you," he said during a forum.

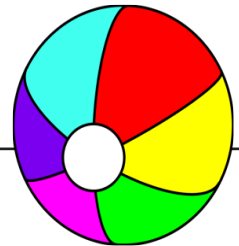

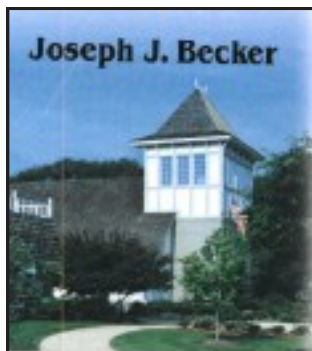
