




1st Vice Message

V.A. News & Info:

- 1- The American Legion's Veterans Memorial Identification Project has already attracted 180 submissions from 36 American Legion departments. Through the project, American Legion Family members can find, photograph, collect information on and upload entries on veterans' memorials and monuments in their area. One goal of the database is to help defend against challenges to memorials that have religious language or symbolism. For more information and to add a memorial to the database, visit the American Legion Memorials webpage.
- 2- The American Legion recently updated its "Let's Be Right on Flag Etiquette" booklet in an effort to increase public knowledge of the proper display and respect for the U.S. Flag. The booklets can be purchased for \$1 each through American Legion Emblem Sales. The American Legion offers a Flag Alert e-newsletter that provides notification when the U.S. Flag is to be displayed at half-staff. Subscribe to the flag e-newsletter on the American Legion Newsletters webpage. For further flag information and resources, visit the American Legion Flag webpage and the Military.com Flag Day page.
- 3- Effective February 27, the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) will change the federal regulations concerning copayments charged to veterans for medications required on an outpatient basis to treat non-service connected conditions. The new tiered copayment structure will decrease the costs of outpatient medications for most veterans. Under the new regulation, copayment amounts

would be fixed and would only vary depending upon the class of outpatient medication in the tier. Veterans who currently do not have a copayment or are exempt by law will not be affected by the change.

4- If you disagree with the decision the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) made on your disability compensation claim, your first step is to file the Notice of Disagreement (VA-Form 21-0958) that was included with your claim decision. If you do not feel confident enough to do this on your own, your Veterans Service Organization (VSO) can help you. The NOD form contains blocks for each issue of contention (the medical conditions for which you filed the claim). The most important section is the narrative to explain why you feel VA incorrectly decided your claim. For more information, read the VA VAntage Point Blog.
